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ABSTRACT

Management and leadership in health services aim to increase efficiency and quality of services at the lowest possible cost. The different types of leadership that can be applied to health services help shape culture, better health service production, and increase efficiency. The present study aims to evaluate the role of leadership in evaluating the efficiency and effectiveness of health services. Secondary research was conducted with a literature review of research on the subject. The results show that leadership contributes significantly to increasing healthcare efficiency and especially to effectiveness, especially in the midst of the Covid-19 pandemic.

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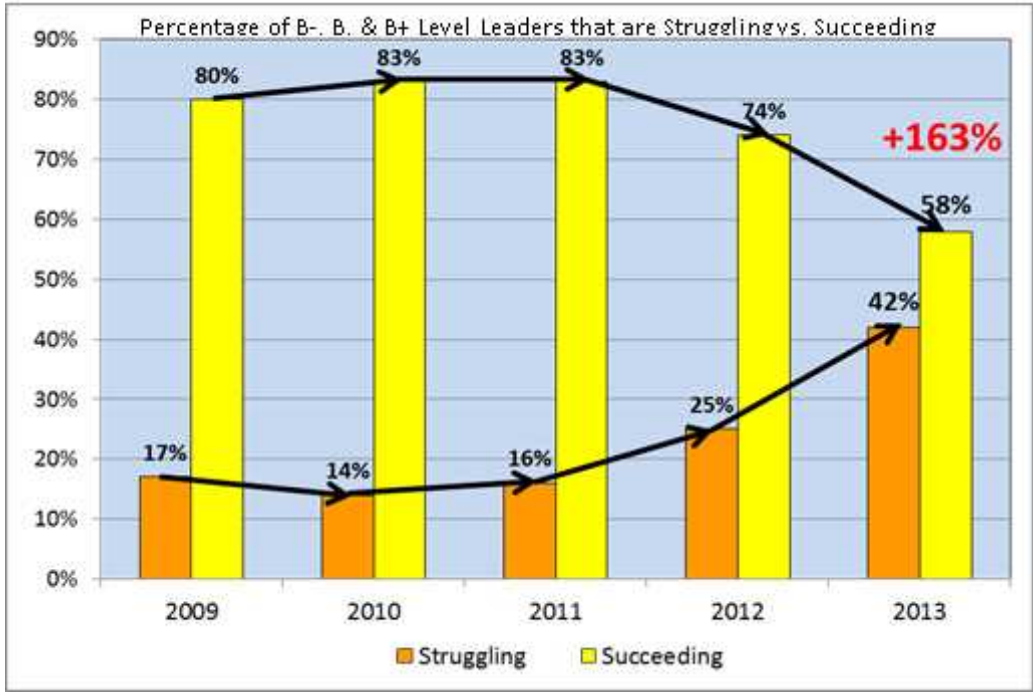
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5.5. Τμήματα

Μεταξύ των ενοικιαστών υπάρχει σημαντική διαφοροποίηση ως προς την οικονομική κατάσταση. Συγκεκριμένα, η ομάδα που αντιστοιχεί στο 8,5% των ενοικιαστών, δηλαδή 20 οικογένειες, ανήκει στην οικονομικά ασθενή ομάδα του πληθυσμού. Η ομάδα αυτή αντιστοιχεί στο 10% των ενοικιαστών που είναι άνετα οικονομικά. Η ομάδα που αντιστοιχεί στο 81,5% των ενοικιαστών, δηλαδή 199 οικογένειες, ανήκει στην οικονομικά ισχυρή ομάδα του πληθυσμού. Η ομάδα αυτή αντιστοιχεί στο 90% των ενοικιαστών που είναι άνετα οικονομικά.

Το ποσοστό των ενοικιαστών που ανήκουν στην οικονομικά ασθενή ομάδα του πληθυσμού είναι υψηλότερο από το ποσοστό των ενοικιαστών που ανήκουν στην οικονομικά ισχυρή ομάδα του πληθυσμού. Αυτό οφείλεται στο γεγονός ότι η ομάδα αυτή είναι μεγαλύτερη από την ομάδα των οικονομικά ισχυρών ενοικιαστών.

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
